Facts

- ♣ All tangible creative works are protected by copyright immediately upon creation.
- Quoting or crediting the author of a copied work does not satisfy copyright requirements.
- When in doubt about either the copyright status of a work or the appropriateness of your use of that work, GET PERMISSION!

Fair Use

To Avoid

Is it Fair Use??

- The purpose and character of use.
- The nature of the copyrighted work.
- ♣ The amount and substantiality of the portion used in the relation to the copyrighted work as a whole.
- The effect of the use upon the potential market for or value of the copyrighted work.



Guidelines

Text:

Up to 10% of a copyrighted work or 1000 words, whichever is less

Poem:

- Entire poem of less than 250 words
- ❖ 250 words or less if longer poem
- No more than 5 poems (or excerpts) of different poets from an anthology
- Only 3 poems (or excerpts) per poet

Motion Media

- ❖ Up to 10% of a copyrighted work or 3min, whichever is less
- Clip cannot be altered in any way

Illustrations

- ❖ A photograph or illustration may be used in its entirety
- No more than 5 images of an artist's or photographer's work
- When using a collection, no more than 10% or no more than 15 images, whichever is less

Music

- Up to 10% of a copyrighted musical composition, but no more than 30 seconds
- Up to 10% of a body of sound recording, but no more than 30 seconds
- Any alterations cannot change the basic melody or the fundamental character of the work

Problems Staff can:

- Use public domain resources whenever possible.
- Develop collaborative efforts with orther teachers to create and disseminate public domain materials for educational use.
- Ask permission, and teach students to ask permission, before using any material about
